So when you are online, here are a few rules:

Do's:

1. Have a friendly Chat
2. Discuss classes and the amount of work you guys are doing.
3. Encourage others to use it just to say Hello.
4. Do POST brain teasers, quiz's, and 'did you knows' on relevant subject TEAMS.
5. Do share tips and tricks you have learnt whilst on line researching or completing set class work.
6. This is your classroom chat space, treat it like you would chat in your classroom.
7. Be constructive and interesting,
8. Do be Nice.

Don'ts:

1. Absolutely no name calling, swearing, rumours or gossip.
2. The POST or Chat page is not an extension of your social media account. Do not use it as such.
3. Think before you POST - Your whole class and your teacher can read what you POST. In our YA TEAM the whole year group can read it, including parents and carers working at home with their kids.
4. When someone is talking (POSTING) don't jump in with meaningless or off topic comments (POSTS). Be constructive and interesting.
5. Do not critique, belittle, make fun of or make inappropriate replies to the POSTS of others
