Year 10 Drama Production Colosseum

"This is not once, long ago. This is not never again. This is our colosseum!"

Written by Ross Mueller and first performed at St Martin's Youth Theatre in 2001, *Colosseum* is set in the grit of Melbourne at the turn of the millennium. It is a multi-layered story about fifteen young lives trying to navigate their way through a series of lifechanging events. The play takes the audience on a winding roller-coaster ride through crises, epiphanies, loneliness, romance and violence. *Colosseum* explores love, death and spirituality as they exist in the here and now.

The annual Year 10 Drama production has become a fixture at Gloucester High School. This year, the talented students of Year 10 Drama are taking on the challenge of producing a two hour full length play of a dramatic script. This is the first serious drama in over ten years of mounting these productions. Director Scott Davis admits that the production of Colosseum has provided students with some serious challenges in terms of both staging and characterisation. "This is a complex play", he said. "There are 57 scenes with multiple locations and 15 characters whose lives all intersect in some manner. Think of great ensemble films like Crash, Traffic and Babel and you will get a sense of the multidimensional nature of this play. It should be a very entertaining and thought-provoking night at the theatre".

The cast of *Colosseum* features Marnie Barkwill, EJ Blanch, Madison Battams, Olivia Corbett, Sophie Dunn, Paula Edwards, Kyra Edstein, Isabelle Erasmus, Chloe Garnham, Maggie Hennessy-O'Reilly, Ebony Hughes, Jasmine Keen, Charlotte Maslen, Sara McBride, Tanisha McNamara, Neve O'Brien, Hayley Rush, Ellie Schumann and Cheyenne Whitfield. The students have been working on the play since the end of Term 3.

Performances are at GLOUCESTER HIGH SCHOOL HALL on FRI DEC 8 AT 7:00PM and SAT DEC 9 AT 2:00PM & 7:00pm. Tickets are \$4.00 at the door. Patrons should note that Colosseum is rated M for mature audiences only as it contains medium level coarse language.

Manning Great Lakes Technology Display and Competition



2018 TAFE

Students who have been successful in their TAFE application have been given a Course offer letter. This letter needs to be signed by the student and their parent / carer in order to finalise their enrolment. Please return signed letter to Mr De Angelis in the Careers Office as soon as possible.

Furthermore, all students who are attending TAFE in 2018 must also complete the mandatory NESA requirement, "ALL MY OWN WORK". Current Year 9 students have not done this yet, but it is something that must be completed before the end of year. They will have to do this in their own time at home or during lunch / recess times on the Library or Distance Education room computers. I will give all students written instructions on how to do this. They MUST complete all 5 Module Quizzes. Each quiz must be printed out with their full name (I will explain this in detail to the students).

HUNTER SPORTS TRIALS 2018

The procedure for attending Hunter Sports Trials has changed for 2018 and beyond. Students wishing to trial for a Hunter teams/sports will need to go to the Hunter School Sport website https://app.education.nsw.gov.au/sport/Hunter and fill out the required information on the website.

This change does not affect qualification for Hunter Swimming/X-Country and Athletics teams.

A consent form can also be found on the website which needs to be signed by the school and then taken to the trial. All relevant information about the trial such as date and time, venue, cost etc can be found on the website. In the past, a booklet with dates etc was sent to the school, this will no longer occur – all information will be on the website only. Please note the important information below:

- Students are required to complete the specific sport requirements on the Hunter School Sport Website (ie: nomination form) to be able to trial for a Hunter team.
- Students need to go to the Hunter School Sports trial with the Hunter Consent Form signed by school principal or nominated person and parent/care giver and all other information completed. If the student fronts up to the Trial without this Consent Form they will not be able to trial for the Hunter Team and therefore will not be eligible for selection.

2018 HUNTER SPORT TRIALS

Students who wish to trial for any of the teams listed below **MUST** follow the following procedure:

- 1. <u>Note the date of the trial and then go to the website nominated on the information sheet to gain details and other information.</u>
- 2. Complete the consent form online and then print and return it to your school Principal and sport coordinator to sign.
- **3. YOU ARE NOT PERMITTED TO ATTEND ANY TRIAL** unless you have **SCHOOL PERMISSION**. If you turn up at the trial without school permission you will be sent **BACK TO SCHOOL**.
- 4. Once the Sport Coordinator has your permission note they will seek the advice of both the Convener and School Coaches as to your eligibility to attend Trials. Students that are too young or are not of the standard or calibre of a Hunter team cannot attend Trials.
- 5. Once the Sport Coordinator signs off on your attendance then you take the completed permission note to the trial.
- 6. NOTE that no transport or direct supervision is supplied by your High School.


HOW TO APPLY TO ATTEND A HUNTER REGION TRIAL


There is a new School Sport Website and all information regarding Hunter trials has been uploaded. The web address is:



- 1. This takes you to the Hunter Sports Website
- 2. Click on the sport you are interested in trialling for on the right hand side under the Hunter logo <Find event>
- Type in the event that you are wishing to trial for and click on the event.
- 4. Dialogue box with the information comes up, click on the <more info> tab on the bottom right







- 5. Takes you to the specific information, click on the <+ symbol> next to Additional information.
- 6. Scroll down to the consent form.
- 7. Click on **<consent form>**, complete it in full, print and then return it to your School Sport Coordinator/Principal to sign and record.
- 8. Take it with you on the day of the trial, hand to the Convener/Manager running the trial.

The music room is available for practise at lunchtime. Please make a booking with Mrs Ingram.



School Newsletter Article: Adolescent human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination program

In early 2017 parents/carers of Year 7 students were asked to provide consent for their children to receive three doses of HPV vaccine in the NSW School Vaccination Program.

Most* Year 7 students who have received two doses of HPV vaccine are considered to be fully vaccinated and do not require a further dose.

This change is based on recent international studies that show for children aged 9 to 14 years of age, two doses of HPV vaccine provide the same protection as three doses, as long as the second dose is given at least six months after the first dose. Based on this evidence, the World Health Organization (WHO) now recommends a two-dose HPV schedule, and this has already been adopted in comparable countries (i.e. the UK, Canada, the United States and New Zealand) and is now being adopted in Australia.

In 2017 Year 7 students were given the second dose of HPV vaccine at least six months after the first dose to accommodate the urgent roll-out of the Meningococcal W Response Program to Year 11 and 12 students. Year 7 students who have received only one dose of HPV this year will be offered their second dose in 2018. Parents/carers whose children were vaccinated in 2017 but who still wish for their child to receive a third dose of HPV vaccine can access a free dose from their general practitioner (GP).

* Students with significantly impaired immune systems are still recommended to have three doses of HPV vaccine. Parents of these students should make arrangements to complete the vaccine course with their GP or by calling their local public health unit on 1300 066 055.






CHAPLAIN'S RAMBLINGS continued......
