




## ANITA ATTAINS DUKE OF EDINBURGH BRONZE AWARD

## SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM UPDATE Missed Vaccinations.

- ALL students in Year 7 (2021) and Year 10 (2021) who missed vaccinations due to the continuing disruptions will be offered catch up vaccination opportunities at the 2022 clinics.
  Students are required to have a consent form signed in 2021 to be eligible for catch up vaccination in 2022.
  These students DO NOT need to be redirected to their GP to receive missed vaccine doses.
- ANY students in Year 8 (2021) and Year 11 (2021) who has missed vaccines will need to attend their local GP to receive missed doses.

## PARENT AND CARER SURVEY ON CONSENT EDUCATION

Students across NSW, both past and present, have called for improved consent education following a petition by former Sydney student Chanel Contos.

Consent is saying yes to something happening or agreeing to do something freely; without fear, force or pressure.

In response to the voices of young people, the heads of the three education sectors signed a **Statement of Intent**. In this Statement, the NSW Department of Education committed to a number of actions – including partnering with parents and carers to improve consent education.

There is now an opportunity for parents and carers to have their say by completing a short survey.

The anonymous survey will help the NSW Department of Education to understand the kinds of resources parents and carers would find helpful in having important conversations about consent with their children – so that we can continue to work together to make sure every student has the knowledge and skills they need to form respectful relationships.

This survey is available in 10 languages other than English and will take less than 10 minutes to complete.

The results will be shared on NSW **Department of Education** website later this year. More information, including answers to frequently asked questions, is also available on **the website**.

The survey will close on 15 December 2021. Parents and carers of NSW Public School students of all ages, from all communities, are encouraged to participate in **the survey**.

#### Question:


ABCD is a rectangle whose area is 12 square units. How many square units are contained in the area of trapezium ABFE?

#### **Previous Answer:**

Strategy: Work right to left.

- $\frac{4}{5}$  of 100 = 80
- **<u>3</u>** of 80 = 60
- $\frac{2}{3}$  of 60 = 40
- $\frac{1}{2}$  of 40 = 20

## FARM SAFETY PROGRAM

In early November our Year 11 Primary Industries class travelled to Taree to attend a quad bike and side-by-side (utility task vehicle) safety course. We learnt to shift our centre of gravity to reduce the risk of roll-overs, how to load on and off trailers and pre-start check up on the quad. On the second day we learnt the pre-start check-up of the side-by-sides and how to safely drive them on steep slopes. The course taught us how to be safe and was really fun – we even received free gear!

The Farm Safety Program is funded by the department to prevent serious accidents and death of students in rural communities and was delivered by Taree TAFE. Thank you for the opportunity.
