MATHS CORNER QUESTION (for students and parents)

Question:

A date is said to be lucky if when written numerically, the product of the day and the month equals the last two digits of the year. For example, 31/3/1993 was a lucky day, since $31 \times 3 = 93$. How many lucky days were there in 1996?

- A. 3 B. 4 C. 5 D. 6 E. 10

Previous Answer:

The initial discount is 10% of \$100 = \$10. So the price before the tax is \$90. The tax is then 10% of \$90 = \$9. The amount then paid is \$99, **hence the answer is B.**

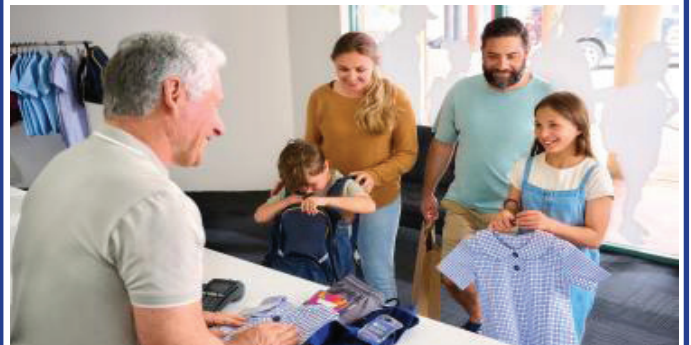
About the vouchers: The Back to School NSW Vouchers program will provide 3 x \$50 vouchers, totalling \$150 for each eligible child.

TRY A TRADE DAY 2022

It was wonderful to be permitted to run our annual Year 9 Try A Trade Day now that COVID restrictions have eased. Fifty-seven students selected a specific industry and participated in activities at school or on work experience placements. The main goal of the day was to provide students with basic, entry level experiences of an industry of their choice. Although it's only a day, the intention is to give each student a taste of what a particular industry would be like. For most students, I believe this objective was met based on their positive feedback provided in a survey they completed at the end of the day.

Months ago, Year 9 students completed career activities which gave an indication of what kind of work students wanted to experience. Based on this information, local employers were contacted, and arrangements were made to conduct the work placements on the day. The sessions allowed students to engage with professional workers within the industry, ask questions, perform basic tasks and/or observe the daily operations of a business. Sam Cornall, our IT Teacher, organised Johnathon McDonald, a micro-controller specialist to come into the school for the day to conduct a workshop on soldering and micro-controllers.

Most students were able to come back to school for a Free Sausage sizzle and a soft drink. Thank you very much to the SRC and particularly Nick, Ryan, Tom and Seth who did an amazing job cooking for all the participants. After lunch, students returned to their employers for Session 2.

Try A Trade Day complements our Careers program and provides present-day, realistic information so students can more successfully navigate their career path by making informed, planned and thoughtful decisions. It's a great prelude to the Work Experience Program which will take place at the end of Term 1 2023. Many students will hopefully have a better idea of where they want to complete Work Experience next year.

This is a unique opportunity and a privilege that is only possible due to the support from the local business community and volunteers.
