
Access keys have been emailed to all new parents. If you have not received your access key, please contact the school.

Gloucester High School recognises that learning and wellbeing are linked, and many initiatives are implemented to support student wellbeing.

We would like to welcome Mrs Chloe McSwan to Gloucester High School Wellbeing team. Chloe has worked with us previously as our School Chaplin and SRE teacher 2013-2015 and is now filling the Student Support Officer role for 2024 whilst Mrs Maddison Middlebrook is on maternity leave. Personal development, health and physical education information for parents

Dear parents and caregivers

This year, students in Year 7-10 will be involved in the mandatory subject Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE). This subject prepares and supports students to lead, and contribute to, healthy, safe and meaningful lives which promote respect, responsibility, enjoyment, inclusion and social justice for self and others.

Our school's PDHPE program covers a wide range of education matter, including relationships, drug use, sexuality and sexual health, body image, mental health and wellbeing, protective strategies, movement skills and performance, safety and physical activity. Some of the content of the program deals with sensitive issues. The school recognises this by teaching about these issues within the context of a developmentally appropriate program and by providing information to you about the program.

The school program will be implemented in a manner that supports the role of parents and caregivers, and reflects the ethos of the school community.

HUNTER TRIALS

All Hunter sports trial applications have moved to the DASH platform. This is the 1st year the Hunter School Sports Association have used DASH so their may be some teething issues. A DASH account must be first created using the instructions provided. You then apply via DASH for the trial(s) you wish to attend. Payment for the trial will be required and can be done through DASH. The school is then notified that you will be attending your preferred trial(s).

Carnivals such as Swimming, X-Country and Athletics are not nominated for via DASH as qualification occurs at Zone (Manning) carnivals.

From a school perspective, permission notes are not required and we will mark the student as absent on "school business" for the day.

If your circumstances change, and you cannot attend a trial that you have nominated for, you are able to withdraw via DASH.

STEP ONE

If you dont already have an account go to DASH and set one up. If you already have one - great - jump to Step 3.



STEP FOUR

Choose the trial that you wish to apply for and begin an application. Dont forget you must pay the Trial levy on the DASH platform





STEP TWO

This is for parents. Add your child to your account, once you log in follow the prompts to complete the application.

STEP FIVE

Complete all steps in the application. The form will be sent directly to the school for approval. Make sure all steps are complete by the due date. No late entries will be accepted!

SWIMMING CARNIVAL 2024



The Gloucester High School swimming carnival will be held at the Gloucester Pool Complex on Tuesday 13 February 2024.

School buses will drop students directly to the pool and will collect the students from the pool at the conclusion of the day.

Pool entry will be \$4.20, unless a season pass has been purchased. The canteen will be open to the students, but no hot food will be available. Students are asked to bring their own lunch!

Swimmers will compete in the division of the age that they are turning in 2024.

Plenty of shade will be provided but students will also need to be sunsmart on the day by wearing sunscreen, shirts and hats.

Parents are welcome to attend the carnival and spectate.

For those students who qualify, the Manning Zone carnival will be held at the Taree Aquatic Centre on Tuesday 27 February 2024.

LAPTOP WARRANTY VS ACCIDENTAL DAMAGE INSURANCE

What is a laptop warranty?

A warranty is provided by manufacturers and means that if some part of your laptop is faulty, they will repair it within the warranty period. For example, if your keyboard stops working, this will be repaired for free. The warranty does not cover any damage caused by accident, and if a technician notes that the laptop looks like its been dropped or something like this, they may refuse to repair it for free.

Some warranties are called 'return to base' - you need to give the laptop back to the supplier to repair. Others are 'on-site' meaning the repairer will come to you. This is important to know, as if it is return to base, you may be without a laptop for several weeks.

Most warranty periods are for 1 year and sometimes you can purchase additional warranty (i.e. upgrade to 2 or 3 years). On the HP BYOD this warranty is 3 years on-site.

What is Accidental Damage Protection Insurance (ADP)?

ADP is insurance that you take up that is an extra cost to the laptop your purchase. It will cover you for any damage caused accidentally. It does not cover theft or loss.

For example, if you child drops or steps on their laptop and they break the screen, this would be repaired under your ADP if you have it.

HP laptops and ADP

Laptops purchased on the Gloucester High School HP BYOD site are eliglible to take out ADP within the first 6 weeks you own the laptop. The HP ADP allows for a certain amount of accidents. You can choose to take out 1 or 3 accidents over the 3 years that your child's laptop is under warranty.

If you have been sent a quote via email, you can either pay this over the phone (contact Katrina Parker 0438 898 814) or you need to log in to the HP BYOD portal first. Steps as follows:

- Go to www.hp.com.au/byod and enter gloucesterHS
- Go back to your email and click on View Quote and Checkout at bottom of email
- In your web browser, you should now see your ADP in the shopping cart and you can pay

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2024 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
	Human papillomavirus (HPV9) vaccine	Single dose
Year 7	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Year 10	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

Schools will distribute a URL and a QR code to all Year 7 and Year 10 parents at the beginning of the 2024 school year which will provide access to an online Parent Information, privacy statement and consent form. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- Enter the URL into your browser, select the School Vaccination Program tile and follow instructions.
- read all the information provided
- complete the online consent form and give consent for which vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

To improve vaccination completion, students whose parents/guardians have provide consent while in Year 7 or Year 10 and who miss vaccine doses at any clinic, will be opportunistically offered these vaccines at each clinic visit throughout 2024 (Year 7 or 10) & 2025 (Year 8 or 11).

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by amending their student's online consent. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at

http://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/withdraw consent.aspx

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to parents by SMS once a student has been vaccinated. Parents/guardians should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this SMS notification.

NOTE: If you experience difficulty with accessing the online consent package, please speak with the School Vaccination coordinator at your school.

CAREERS NEWS

Year 10 is a very important year for several reasons. From a career point of view many significant decisions must be made, regardless of whether students are leaving after Year 10 or continuing to Year 12, in relation to a career path.

Year 10 Work Experience

The Work Experience programme for 2024 will run from:

Tuesday 2 April to Friday 12 April (Weeks 10 and 11 of Term 1).

This is 9 working / school days in total.

For insurance details to be completed, we will need to have all applications processed by Monday 25 March. At this stage, all students should have received Application Forms (Student Placement Record) and we will begin Work Experience preparation through Career lessons. Students are encouraged to contact potential employers face to face or via phone or email and have the Student Placement Record (SPR) signed by the employer. However, if there is difficulty doing this, I can post / email them, upon student request, to complete the required forms.

The Student Placement Record has a section to be completed by the student, a section for parents / carers, and a section for employers to complete. The employer section must have the name, address, and contact details, so I will be able to touch base with them. Students may choose to have one placement with the same employer for the two-week duration or two placements, one week each. This is something students will need to negotiate with host employers.

Students that wish to work on a building site with any tradesman for Work Experience must have completed the WH&S White Card Course before commencing their placement. We will be delivering or contracting another RTO to deliver a White Card Course this term on Wednesday 20 March (Week 8)

We wish to advise all parents, students, and guardians that those students who are eligible and have been approved for a 2024 School Bus pass these will be posted to the students home/postal address through our mailing centre after the 24th January 2024 and bus passes should be received in the mail by the 9th February 2024. We do ask for your patience due to delivery times through Australia Post. If you do not receive your bus pass by the 9th February please contact your local depot office.



Please note that there is a moratorium period till the 29th of February 2024 which allows sufficient time for students to receive their travel passes.

Please ensure that once your child receives their Bus Pass they must show this to the Bus Driver each time they board the bus.

The following may apply to you if you do not receive a 2024 School Bus Pass:

- You will only need to re-apply for a school travel pass or update details if the student:
 - · changes school or campus.

 - · is going to Year 3 or to Year 7

Not Eligible for SSTS School Bus Pass

If your child has not been approved or deemed ineligible by TfNSW to receive a SSTS School bus pass then they must pay a fare to the driver when boarding or purchase a Term Pass. If your application is unsuccessful, or if further information is required, you will receive advice by email from TfNSW. If you believe there are special circumstances about your application, you can request a review from TfNSW.




